

2018 Youth Forum Challenge

Challenge Background

This year we are launching the first ever Youth Forum Challenge! In completing this challenge, we want all girls to learn more about the World Centers and Guiding around the world while still having fun. This challenge provides an opportunity for girls to explore different cultures in creative ways, and learn about girls just like them all around the world.

Each branch has been assigned a World Center (listed below), and is required to complete a specified amount of activities from their section to complete the challenge.

Sparks: Must complete 3 of the following 6 activities (badge: world around me)

1. Make paper dolls with the Guiding uniforms from England
2. Host a tea party with the Queen
3. Try a traditional snack from England (Possibly at the tea party)
4. Play a traditional game for England
5. Host a birthday party for Lady Baden Powell
6. Learn the Spark promise from England

Brownies: Must complete 3 of the following 6 activities

1. Make paper dolls with Guiding uniforms from Mexico
2. Make a traditional snack from Mexico (possibly at Mexican birthday party)
3. Try a traditional game from Mexico (Mexican Hat Dance)
4. Write a letter to a pen pal in Guiding in Mexico (Up to the leaders if they want to actually send them)
5. Host a Mexican Birthday party
6. Talk about the poverty in Mexico and collect food to donate to your local food bank

Guides: Must complete 4 of the following 6 activities (badges: world Guiding, cultural awareness, learn about WAGGGS)

1. Learn the Our Chalet song
2. Make a traditional dish from Switzerland
3. Play a traditional game from Switzerland
4. Write a letter to a pen pal in Guiding in Switzerland (UP to the leaders if they want to actually send them)
5. Plan and prepare and go for a hike
6. Learn about the uniforms and promise of Guides in Switzerland



Pathfinders: Must complete 4 of the following 6 activities

1. Make a traditional dish from India
2. Discuss poverty in India and collect items to donate to your local food bank
3. Learn a traditional song or dance from India
4. Pretend to plan a Guiding trip to Sangam in India
5. Learn about the currency, wages, women inferiority in the work place in India
6. Discuss the importance of clean water and lack thereof in India

Rangers: Must complete 4 of the following 6 activities

1. Create a book of stories, poems, and nursery rhymes from Africa
2. Discuss the poverty in Africa and spend a meeting volunteering at your local food bank
3. Learn about the currency, wages, women inferiority in the work place in Africa
4. Make a traditional meal from Africa
5. Learn about how and where they import and export food in Africa
6. Learn a traditional song or dance from Africa

Adult Members: Must complete one activity from each branch
